#### History of "Sportsmanship 1" All-Star Games By Norbert A. Baschnagel 1/31/17

The "Sportsmanship 1" All-Star Basketball Games were conceived and initiated in 2000 by Norbert Baschnagel, former Clarion University full professor in the Health and Physical Education Department. Under his direction, the objectives of "Sportsmanship 1" were to recognize the outstanding seniors in the boys' and girls' Western Pennsylvania leagues and have them play one last game, raise money for the Clarion County YMCA, and present the Western Pennsylvania "Sportsmanship 1" Sportsperson of the Year award to the person who emphasizes the true meaning of sportsmanship in our society.

To date, 680 exceptional senior girl and senior boy basketball players, coached by 136 coaches and officiated by 102 officials have participated in this event. Players are selected by the executive committee of 15 members, 4 male and female coaches from the four District 9 leagues, and 2 officials from District 9. The executive committee also supervises the logistics of this event.

To date, approximately \$124,000 in cash and product has been raised by the executive committee to benefit the Clarion County YMCA, Camp Coffman, and other non-profit charities over the years including the Fitzgerald Ramp Fund and Clarion P.A.W.S.

The success of this event is guaranteed by the dedication of the Executive Committee, players, coaches, officials, media staff, athletic director, superintendent, administrative assistant, awards committee, games announcer, trainer, registration staff, concession staff, scorekeeper, photographer, ticket and program staff, program designer, 32 shooting staff, maintenance staff, national anthem vocalist, and Clarion University Circle "K" volunteer students.
